SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Esperanza High School is a public, four-year, comprehensive high school located in a primarily residential community in the northeast part of Orange County. Our attendance area includes some neighborhoods in the cities of Yorba Linda, Anaheim, and Placentia. The socioeconomic level is predominantly middle class with 10% qualifying for Free/Reduced Lunch Program. This year, we are proud to enroll 1,523 students in grades 9 through 12. The ethnic distribution of our student population is approximately 44% Caucasian, 37% Hispanic, 9% Asian, 5% African American, and 5% other or declined to state. Our 2021 graduating class is comprised of 383 students. This class holds an average unweighted GPA of 3.09 with the highest weighted GPA being 4.74. We do not rank our students. Each year over 88% of Esperanza's graduates continue on to further their education at a wide variety of institutions.

Esperanza High School was recognized as a California Distinguished School in 2002, and was awarded The California Gold Ribbon Award in 2015.

The 2020 US News and World Report ranked Esperanza High School 433rd in the state of California and 2,945th out of more than 24,000 schools nationally. Our robust extracurricular programs include: Academic Decathlon, Debate and Forensics, Journalism, Dance Team, Cheer, Vocal and Instrumental Music. Esperanza is home to the Medical Sciences Academy, Aztec Engineering Manufacturing Academy, and ABC Teacher Pathway. Since established in 2008, our Medical Sciences Academy students continue to compete and earn medals at the California State Leadership Conference and qualify to advance to the national level in areas such as Medical Photography, Biomedical Debate, Medical Assisting, and Medical Law and Ethics. Esperanza is one of only sixty schools in the country to receive P.R.I.M.E. (Partnership Response In Manufacturing Education) status for our Aztec Engineering Manufacturing Academy. Newer to the school is the ABC Teacher Pathway, where the capstone class provides students the opportunity to intern at a local elementary school for two hours per day.

In July 2019, Esperanza received a full SIX YEAR CLEAR accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Only 10% of California High Schools receive this level of accreditation



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students need a total of 230 credits to graduate, with credit requirements in the following areas:

- Language Arts/English 40 credits
- History/Social Science 30 credits
- Mathematics 20 credits (including Algebra 1)
- Science 20 credits
- Fine Art, World Language or Career Technical Education 10 credits
- Physical Education or Athletics 20 credits
- Health 5 credits
- College & Career Readiness 5 credits
- Electives 80 credits

The community service requirement has been waived for the Class of 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

GPA/GRADING SCALE

A 4.0 grading scale is utilized. The value of each grade for computing unweighted grade point average is A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and F=0. <u>All</u> Advanced Placement and Honor courses are given an <u>extra grade point</u>. These courses are marked with a "+" on the transcript. College preparatory classes are marked with a "p" on the transcript. For the Spring 2020 semester only, students could choose, by class, a traditional letter grade or Pass/Incomplete. P=grades A-D and I=grade F.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS COURSE
